### Type UC3 Libby Amiel and Brian Candler

Single level three bedroom courtyard house with study. Renovated internally, with some areas of double glazing. Faces west.

### Type UC5 Heide and David Watson

North facing single level courtyard house with four bedrooms, study and a store room. Some renovations but no structural changes. Original owners.

### Type UC5 Louise Curham and Peter Shaw

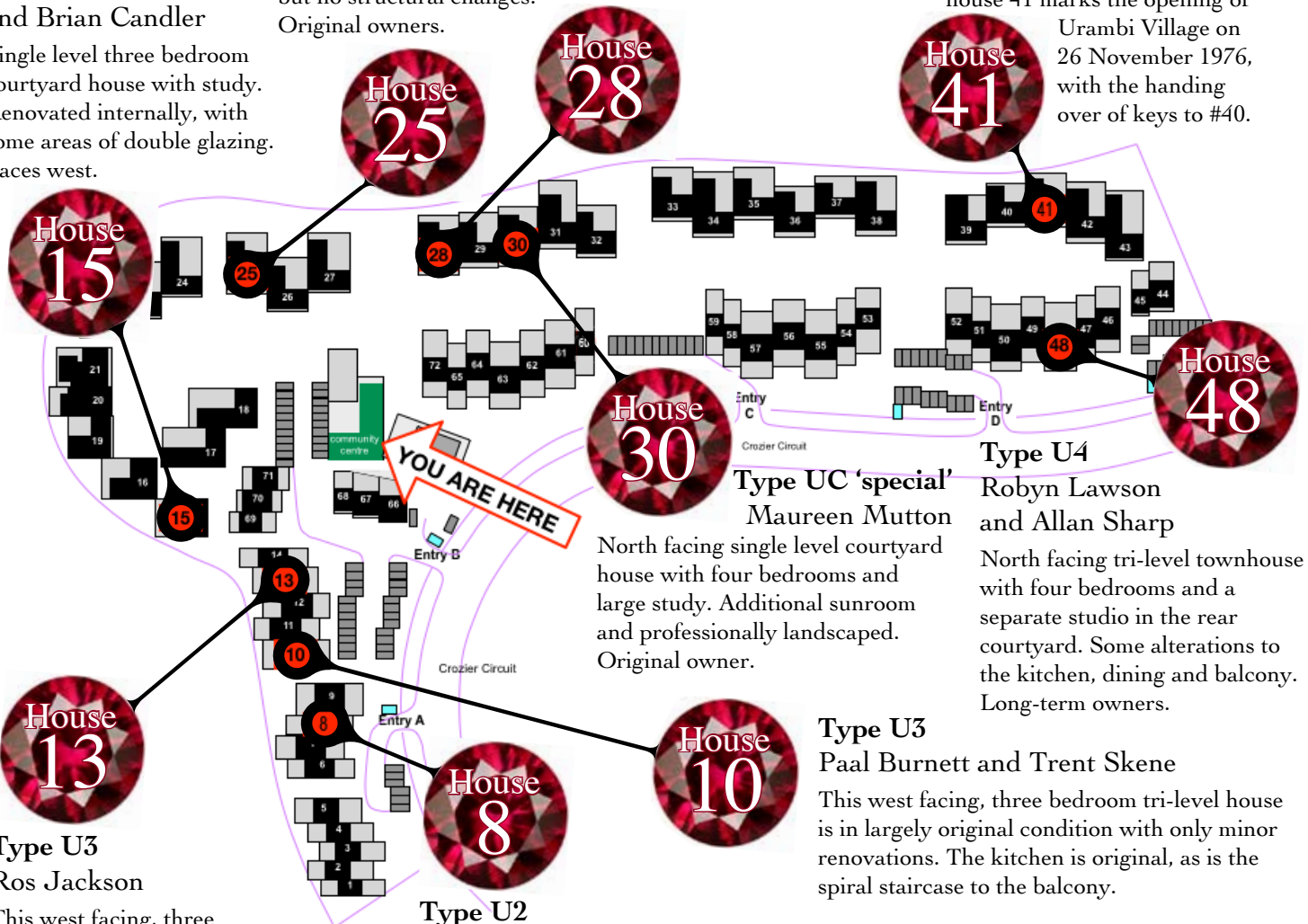
North facing single level courtyard house with four bedrooms and large study. Sloping, timber lined ceiling to main rooms is an original feature. Second owners.

### Type UC3 The late Alastair Swayn

North facing, single level courtyard house with two bedrooms and a study. Extensively renovated and professionally landscaped.

### Commemorative plaque

A plaque near the entrance to house 41 marks the opening of Urambi Village on 26 November 1976, with the handing over of keys to #40.



### Type U3 Ros Jackson

This west facing, three bedroom tri-level house has undergone some renovations, including an extended balcony.

### Type U2 Meryl Hampson

West facing, two bedroom tri-level house with living areas on the lower level; bathroom and kitchen at the middle entry level; and bedrooms at the upper level. Mezzanine study. Renovated bathroom and kitchen.

### Type UC 'special' Maureen Mutton

North facing single level courtyard house with four bedrooms and large study. Additional sunroom and professionally landscaped. Original owner.

### Type U4 Robyn Lawson and Allan Sharp

North facing tri-level townhouse with four bedrooms and a separate studio in the rear courtyard. Some alterations to the kitchen, dining and balcony. Long-term owners.

### Type U3 Paal Burnett and Trent Skene

This west facing, three bedroom tri-level house is in largely original condition with only minor renovations. The kitchen is original, as is the spiral staircase to the balcony.
